Iowa District 22 Motocross
2013 Supplemental Rules**

General Rules, Motocross Points & Rules, Mini Cycle Motocross Rules

General Rules

1. The AMA rule book shall be followed in its entirety. However, District 22 supplemental rules shall govern those cases not provided for in the AMA rule book.
2. All District 22 Officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Congress Delegates, Events Coordinator, Points Steward, Membership Director, and Webmaster, will be allowed complimentary admission to all AMA District 22 Sanctioned meets. This will apply to gate fee only and only if the officer has a membership card as proof of office. This complimentary admission would apply to meet entry only.
3. No District 22 officer or member of the Executive Board may spend more than \$400.00 without prior approval of the board.
4. Tracks or courses which do not meet AMA standards will be notified in writing by the Executive Board. The following actions will be taken:
 - A. The Executive Board will ask the track referee or owner to correct the wrong.
 - B. If no action is taken to correct the problem, the Executive Board will contact the Amateur Activities Manager of the AMA requesting removal of remaining sanctions.
5. District 22 Points paying, Hare Scramble/ Enduro meets can be sanctioned with a minimum of 14 days' notice, recommended 30 days notice, on open Enduro/Harescramble dates only.
 - A. Promoter must notify all other District 22 promoters via email.
6. District clubs and promoters are responsible for signing up riders, sending forms and money to the Director of Membership within 7 working days after the meet. Clubs or promoters not making payments of collected funds will be charged a \$20.00 service fee. All fees will be collected before sanctioning for the following year's meets will be allowed. If fees are not sent to District 22 within 30 days, the Executive Board will contact the AMA and request removal of remaining sanctions.
7. Points Steward will mail point standings to the top 10 riders in each class after the last point race of the year. A standard cover letter will be sent, with a time frame of 14 days to respond to any changes or corrections. After that date all points will be final. All other point standings, outside the top 10, are available upon request to the Points Steward.
8. To receive District 22 points and year end awards, you must be a current member of District 22.
9. Any new promoter or club wanting to schedule a Motocross District 22 meet must submit a surety bond or cash deposit of \$5000.00, 30 days prior to the District 22 Sanctioning meeting. This will be refunded when termination of meets and all liabilities are settled.
10. End of year series points will be posted on the District 22 website prior to December 1st. There will be a 14 day time-period for riders to ask questions or identify errors. The results become final on December 21st.

Motocross Points and Rules

1. In order to qualify for the Iowa District 22 Motocross Championship a rider must hold a valid current year District 22 membership card.
 - A. Points will not be awarded until you have a valid membership card.
2. All riders under 18 years of age will send a birth certificate to the Membership Director, with a notarized application. Parents, legal guardian, or notarized consent must accompany all participants under 18 years of age, unless a rider is in possession of their AMA Annual competition release.
3. District 22 State Championship points paying system:
 - A. For 2013 the AMA District 22 Motocross Championship Series will consist of up to 14 events with the provision for up to two additional points paying events being granted to new clubs/promoters at the rate of one race per new club/promoter on open dates only. No District 22 club/promoter will hold any event on the same day as any scheduled District 22 Motocross Championship event is sanctioned. The official dates for the 2013 season will be determined by the MX Group and will be published prior to January 1st, 2014.
 - B. Point accumulation for end of year awards for the District 22 Motocross Championship Series for 2013:
 - a. Each rider's top 12 bike finishes (top 9 quad finishes per class) will be scored towards the 2013 Iowa District 22 Motocross Championship.
 - b. Rider point ties will be broken by the most number of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. finishes at meets with 5 or more riders in the class. Then by points accumulation at meets with 1-4 riders.
 - c. District 22 Champion points per class will be as follows:

- d. 21st place and down will receive 1 point.
- e. No points will be awarded to any rider with the following combination of scores: DNF/DNF, DNF/DNS, or DNS/DNF.

5. All riders participating in a District 22 meet must hold a current \$25 District 22 card, a current out-of-state district card or have purchased a \$5 District 22 one day pass, to compete in District 22 meets." **All clubs and promoters are responsible for verifying proof of membership, whether it is a current District 22 or out-of-state district card. Rider receipt is void after 30 days from original date.**
6. The **125** and **Women** classes are open to A, B, and C riders. For B and C riders to keep amateur status eligibility for the B and C classes, the rider cannot receive prize money per AMA Competition Rule Book.

7. The **14-24 B/C** class will be a trophy class only. Engine displacement will be **122cc-OPEN with a minimum wheel base of 53" per AMA Rule Book.**
8. Dress code will conform to current AMA RULES: AMA approved helmet, goggles, long sleeved jersey, and high-top boots. (Minimum of 8" high)
9. All ATV's must be equipped with a functional tether type mechanical kill device attached to the vehicle and to the rider, so that the engine ignition is cutoff at any time when the rider becomes separated from the ATV.
10. The yellow flag denotes caution. Penalties are up to the referee of the day. No passing on the ambulance flag. Penalty will be disqualification for the day. (Up to discretion of the track referee.)
11. All tracks must conform to the Motocross start rules found in the current AMA Rules. The 2min/1min card or lights should be used.
12. Any rider found illegal, due to tear-down, protest, refusal to tear-down, or over/under the age limit, will be subject to penalties of the current AMA Rules.
13. Three number plates are required. **ATV'S must have visible front and rear number plates.** When numbered jerseys and helmets are worn, the numbers must match the numbers on the bike. Numbers must be clearly visible with contrasting colors. It is recommended that number plate colors be as followed.
 - A. A Class: White with Black Numbers
 - B. B Class: Yellow with Black Numbers
 - C. C Class: Black with White Numbers

❖ Non-legible number plates are subject to no score per the track's discretion.
14. Any new promoter or club wanting to schedule a Motocross District 22 meet must submit a surety bond or cash deposit of \$5000.00, 30 days prior to the D22 Sanctioning meeting. This will be refunded when termination of meets and all liabilities are settled.
15. Any additional rain dates must be rescheduled on *open dates only* through the Iowa District 22 Motocross, with a minimum of 5 days between notification and race date. Iowa District 22 Motocross Championship points will be given. Rain dates must be posted on both the district and promoter's website as soon as possible.
16. Motocross clubs and promoters are responsible for collecting \$2.00 per rider from each points paying class at their meets. Motocross clubs or promoters must send the money to the treasurer and points to the Motocross Points Steward of Iowa District 22 Motocross within 7 days of the meet. The money is to be used for the year-end awards and promotion. If not received within 15 days Motocross clubs and/or promoters will be fined \$100 per occurrence.
17. For every Iowa District 22 Motocross meet all points and race cancellations will be sent to the Motocross Points Steward within 7 days after the meet. If not received within 15 days, Motocross clubs and/or promoters will be fined \$100 per occurrence.
18. Riders may not compete in 2 classes being run together in the same Moto. Participation in 3 classes means 3 different Motos per AMA Rule Book.
19. The 2013 Iowa District 22 Motocross Championship Season will run from March 1st through October 31st.
20. A legal ambulance, per current AMA Rule Book, must be on site at all times during AMA Iowa District 22 Motocross sanctioned meets.
21. All protests must be made in writing, with the appropriate fee and in accordance to the AMA rule book.

Mini Cycle Motocross Rules

1. All riders participating in a District 22 meet must hold a current District 22 card or a current out-of-state district card to compete in District 22 meets. ***All clubs and promoters are responsible for verifying proof of membership, whether it is a current District 22 or out-of-state district card. Rider receipt is void after 30 days from original date.***
2. All riders under 18 years of age will send a copy of their birth certificate to the Membership Director with a notarized application. This will serve as proof of age.

3. Maximum age is **16** years old, according to the current AMA rule book.
4. Maximum engine size is 85cc 2 stroke or 150cc 4 stroke, if only one mini class is run.
5. There will be a tear-down or protest fee on all minis according to the current AMA rule book.
6. Any rider found illegal, due to tear-down, protest, refusal to tear-down, or over the age limit, will be subject to penalties of the current AMA rule book.

8. All riders must wear an AMA approved helmet, eye protection, long sleeved shirt, and boots. Boots must be laced, buckled, zippered, or designed and constructed for leg and foot protection in accordance with the current AMA rule book.
9. Riders may ride a maximum of 4 youth classes per day. Riders may not compete in 2 classes being run together in same Moto. Participation in 4 classes means 4 different Motos.
10. Rider's eligibility is determined as per AMA Competition rule book.
11. All protests must be made in writing, with the appropriate fee and in accordance to the AMA rule book.
